As Educators. We educate students first and then, through them, we reach the larger community.

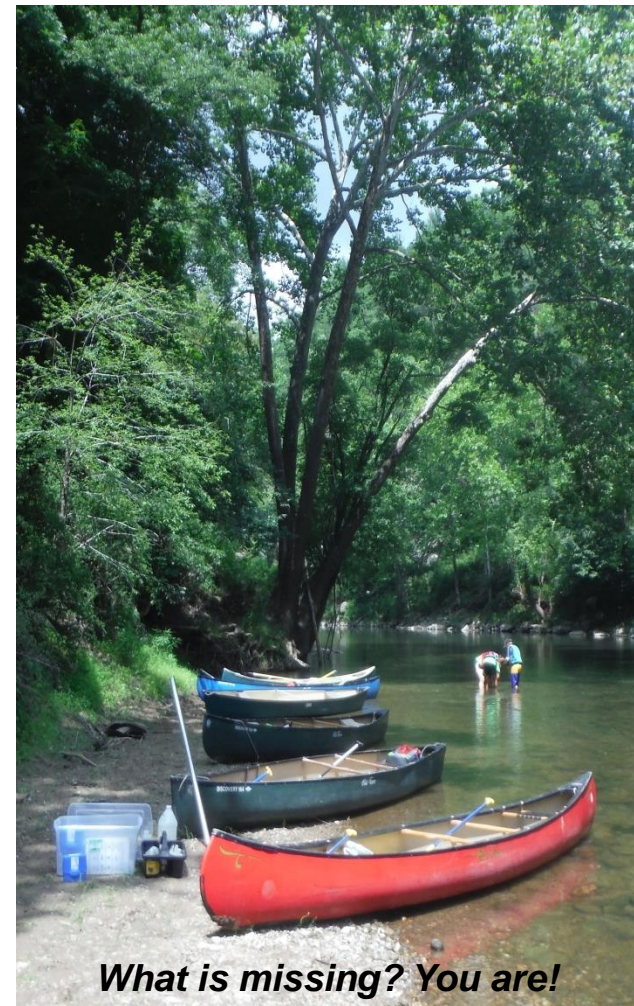
As Foresters. We are creating healthy communities alive with trees.

Stream Scholars Summer Camp

Scholars will meet, learn, and work with youth from across the Potomac Headwaters as they use field techniques and laboratory equipment to test water quality in the Cacapon and Potomac rivers. Scholars explore West Virginia's connection to the Chesapeake Bay and learn the important role we all play in protection local waters and the Bay.

Costs

Total cost of camp is \$200 including meals, canoeing, hiking trips, transportation and all activities at The Mountain Institute. A non-refundable \$25.00 is due upon registration. The remaining \$175 is due by June 12. Camp is limited to ten.
