This was a very successful WV Project CommuniTree planting at River Ridge HOA in Great Cacapon on Saturday, May 7, 2016.

The community residents arrived very willing and ready to plant the new trees. There was a wonderful volunteer turnout with 17 River Ridge residents participating.

The holes for the trees were dug prior to planting day. On the morning of the planting, Frank Rodgers from Cacapon Institute led the group in a planting demonstration on the proper techniques for planting a tree. Some residents stated that this was the first formal lesson they had ever received on this topic.

Leader Ron Skeans were the expertise and guidance provided by Cacapon Institute throughout the project, the quality of the trees, and most importantly watching the community come

together to support the project.
